CPAG04/25 8a	Glossop Transition for Clinical Policies	НМ	Following the Government's decision in July 2021 to align Glossop with the Derbyshire Integrated Care System (ICS), a process was agreed at the July 2023 CPAG meeting and ratified by the Population Health & Strategic Commissioning Committee to review and compare DDICB policies with those of Greater Manchester. The approach taken offered a timely and manageable solution for comparing DDICB policies with those of Greater Manchester to assess variations and ensure appropriate Patient and Public Involvement duties. A summary of the programme outputs are as follows: 88 DDICB Clinical Policies reviewed and compared with Glossop (Greater Manchester) policies. Of these, 19 policies with significant differences were referred for Patient and Public Involvement assessment: 14 policies assessed as "Inform" (to be communicated via the CPAG Bulletin). 5 policies assessed as "legal duties do not apply" (no further action required). The remaining 69 policies are either aligned or have minor differences.
